



Michael Chang & Kei Nishikori Compete for Charity In World Class Tennis Doubles Pro Exhibition

2018 Michael Chang Tennis Classic to Benefit HomeAid OC and Chang Family Foundation, Expected to Raise \$100,000+

Newport Beach, Calif., June 27, 2018 – World champion tennis players Michael Chang and Kei Nishikori will compete in a World Class Doubles Pro Exhibition to raise funds for HomeAid Orange County and the Chang Family Foundation. Chang became the youngest male player to win a Grand Slam singles title when he won the French Open in 1989 at 17. Nishikori is Japan's #1 professional tennis player. Chang has served as Nishikori's coach since 2014.

Being held from 5:00 to 9:00 p.m. on Sat., July 21, 2018, the 8th Annual Michael Chang Tennis Classic (MCTC) fundraiser event includes the professional exhibition match as well as a USC vs. UCLA undercard match and top sponsor tennis. It is being held at the Newport Beach Tennis Club, 2601 Eastbluff Drive, Newport Beach. <u>General admission tickets</u> are \$50 online and \$60 at the door. Food and drinks are available for purchase. Autograph opportunity at the end of the professional exhibition match.

"We are very proud to support HomeAid, which is devoted to building new lives for homeless families and individuals in Orange County through housing and community outreach," said Michael Chang. About the Exhibition Match Players

Kei Nishikori is Japan's #1 professional tennis player. He is the only male Japanese tennis player ever to be ranked inside the top 5 in ATP Singles Ranking. Nishikori began playing tennis at five years old and qualified for his first ATP main draw event at the Countrywide Classic in Los Angeles at 17. Nishikori was named ATP Newcomer of the Year in 2008 and has won 11 singles titles. He was runner-up at the 2014 US Open which made him the first-ever male player from an Asian country to reach a Grand Slam singles final. Nishikori also became the first man from Asia to qualify for the ATP World Tour Finals having reached the semi-finals in 2014.

Michael Chang is an American tennis player who became the youngest male player to win a Grand Slam singles title when he won the French Open in 1989 at 17. Known for his on-court speed and fighting spirit, Chang is considered by many observers to have been one of the best defensive baseliners of all time. He also introduced the jumping two-handed backhand. Notably, Chang was inducted into the International Tennis Hall of Fame in 2008. Since 2014, Chang has served as coach for Kei Nishikori.
